November 5, 2022 (Miami, FL) – A Miami non-for-profit, Innovation Tech Academy, has been awarded a GenCyber grant from the National Security Agency and the National Science Foundation to teach cybersecurity through the CyberHoops basketball camp. This free one-week summer camp is for 30 underrepresented middle and high school students from Miami Dade County.

The GenCyber program seeks to ignite and sustain cybersecurity interest at the K-12 level in order to build a competent, diverse, and adaptable cybersecurity workforce pipeline through alignment with the National Centers of Academic Excellence in Cybersecurity (NCAE-C). The GenCyber program is financially supported by the National Security Agency, the National Science Foundation* and other federal partners on an annual basis.

Innovation Tech Academy (ITA) is a non-for-profit that provides technology-related online courses to students in the areas of cybersecurity, digital citizenship, internet of things, ethical hacking and other technology related areas. ITA's mission is to create user-friendly technology courses that teach and impact young adults from various minority backgrounds and underserved communities, providing much needed exposure and awareness at a young age to motivate and inspire academic and professional pathways.
